Field trips and tours are an exciting and fun way to instill an awe for God's creation and confidence in the accuracy of the Bible. Field trips can be as simple as a hike or picnic and observing the incredible aspects of creation all around us, or they can be more planned outings like touring Yellowstone or Costa Rica. Evidence of biblical creation is all around us and this talk highlights the beauty and complexity of God's wonderful creation.

Ann Hamblin-Step Up With Ann: A Four-Step Approach in Learning Grammar and Essay Writing

Individuals have studied grammar and writing since they were old enough to learn; yet, each subsequent year those same individuals must relearn the same rules or the same definitions they had previously learned because they still do not understand how to use grammar or how to develop the writing process. Step Up with Ann is a complete online proofreading course and a writing course that uses a "common-sense" approach to learning. This workshop is designed for parents of 12-year olds and older (including college students). How are these courses appropriate for such variation in age? The answer is simple: These courses are built upon mastery of skill, not grades! Grammar is grammar regardless of the grade level; an essay is an essay regardless of one's classification. Oftentimes parents are unsure how to help their learners understand grammar or writing outside of a text. This workshop will allow the parent to become the student; he or she will experience a "hands-on" simulation of how to use the four-step grammar and writing approaches to understand these skills. At the end of the workshop, the parent will possess an awareness of how the four-step proofreading approach guides the learner in the identification of grammatical errors; in addition, the parent will have a clearer understanding of the essay and its organization and development using the four steps. A valuable by-product of using these approaches is the building of critical thinking skills. There is nothing "rocket science" about these approaches; they are practical, involve common sense, and provide an understanding of the importance proofreading is to communication through writing. (A writing rubric will be provided to those in attendance.)

Benjamin Myers-ActorsBible: Dad Directed Interactive Family Devotions
